As we go through Lent and we hear the witness testimony of Jesus's enemies from the book "The Gospel According to Jesus' Enemies" by Dann J Ettner. I hope you are looking at your what your own testimony would have been during that time. Last week we heard from Saron, who was one of the arresting soldiers.

The part that struck me in this witnessing of Saron is when they first get to the Garden of Geth-semane and they see Jesus standing there. Jesus looks like the man in charge to the soldiers. Jesus asks the soldiers whom they had come for. The reply of course "Jesus of Nazareth". Jesus replies: "I am He". The entire group of solders and all the others that were there, stepped back and fell to the ground. No one touched each other. No one shoved anyone but they all simultaneously as if choreographed beforehand stepped back. The felt the power of Jesus. Now they all wrote it off as just something that happened and they didn't believe Jesus was the son of God as they felt if Jesus would have done something to save himself.

This week our Gospel is John 3:16-21 and it tells us why -

John 3: 16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. "

John 3:16-21 as we read the entire passage it speaks about Love God has for us as he offers salvations through Jesus and it also notes that the wicked shy away from the light so that their evil not be exposed. The passage also states that the wicked shy away from the light so that their evil doings will not be exposed.

You have now heard the testimony of Caiaphas the High Priest and the Arresting Soldier Soran. Next week we will hear from the Crowd who shouted, "Crucify Him".
